Dr. Marisa Rogers completed her undergraduate and medical education at Emory University and her internal medicine residency at Brigham and Women's Hospital. She is currently an Associate Professor in Clinical Medicine at HUP.

### What made you interested in your current field of medicine?

I always knew I wanted to be a primary care physician. I really enjoy forming relationships with patients and providing care over a longitudinal period of time. The many factors that influence health such as economic status, education, and access to medical care are of interest to me. I am interested in the physician's role in addressing these barriers. 
